**A Band D Property pays £232.82 per year for policing**

**Q How much more would you be prepared to pay per year through your council tax for policing?**

- No more than you pay now – a precept freeze. This would mean a real terms cut to the police budget when inflation is taken into account
- As per last year – an extra £11.50 per year for a Band D property raising £3.5m
- Between £11.50 and £24 – raising up to £7m
- More than £24 - raising more than £7m

## Fire & Rescue

**A Band D Property pays £69.20 per year for the fire and rescue service**

**Q How much more would you be prepared to pay per year through your council tax for the fire and rescue service?**

- No more than you pay now – a precept freeze. This would mean a real terms cut to the fire and rescue budget when inflation is taken into account
- As per last year - a 2.99% increase. An extra £2.07 per year for a Band D property raising £600k
- Between £2.07 and £5 – raising up to £1.5m
- More than £5 – raising more than £1.5m

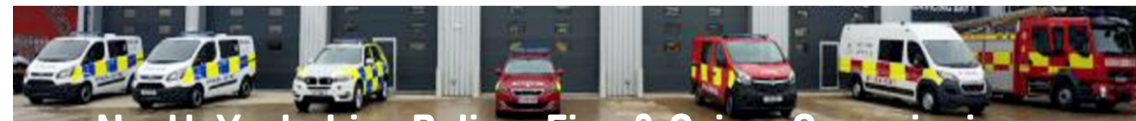

# NORTH YORKSHIRE POLICE

## How is North Yorkshire Police funded?

About 52 per cent of funding comes from the Government while the remaining 48 per cent is raised locally, mainly through the 'police precept' – the amount you pay for policing in your council tax.

**Demand for policing is increasing, whilst funding is shrinking, meaning North Yorkshire Police needs to make savings of £10m recurring from 2020.**



# NORTH YORKSHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

## How is North Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service funded?

About 30 per cent of funding comes from the Government while the remaining 70 per cent is raised locally, mainly through the 'fire & rescue precept' – the amount you pay for the local fire and rescue service in your council tax.

**Due to increasing costs and reduced government funding, the North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service needs to make savings of £3.5m recurring from 2020.**



## What are the options for local funding?

An average Band D property pays £232.82 per year for policing. The Government has allowed Police and Crime Commissioners to increase this by £24. This would raise up to £7m.

## An increase of £24 would mean:

## What are the options for local funding?

An average Band D property pays £69.20 per year for the fire and rescue service. The Government currently caps the amount of money Julia can raise by 2.99% or £2.07. This would raise up to £600k but will leave considerable financial challenges.

## An increase of £2.07 would mean:
