

National referral mechanism - NRM




- The National Framework for identifying, assessing and supporting potential victims of Modern Slavery
- 23% decrease nationally peak covid (no change across North Yorks)
- 4570 children referred nationally in 2019 (65 across North Yorkshire)
- Challenges:
 - Victim Engagement
 - Victim or Perpetrator
- The way forward – S47 must be our threshold



Care Leavers



A care leaver is broadly defined as a person aged between 16 and 25, who has been looked after by a local authority for at least 13 weeks since the age of 14, is either currently in care or has left care and has been looked after for a period of time after their 16th birthday.
