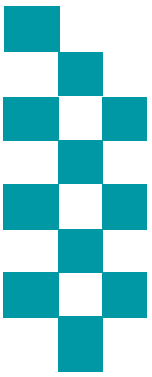

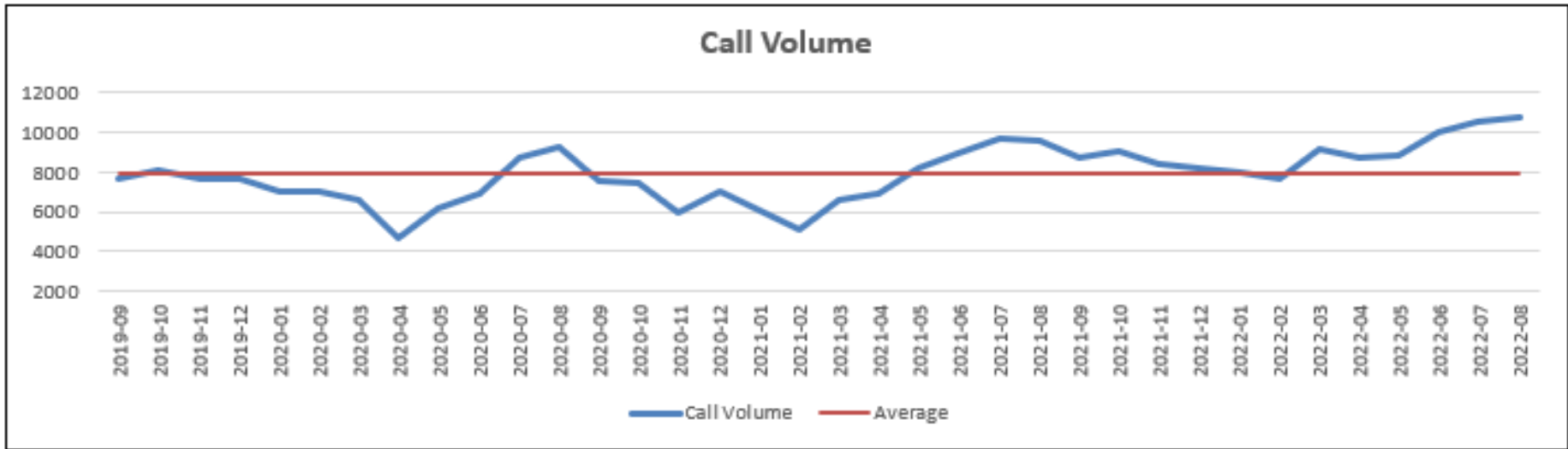

Call Volume trend (blue line) for the period 01st September 2019 – 31st August 2022.



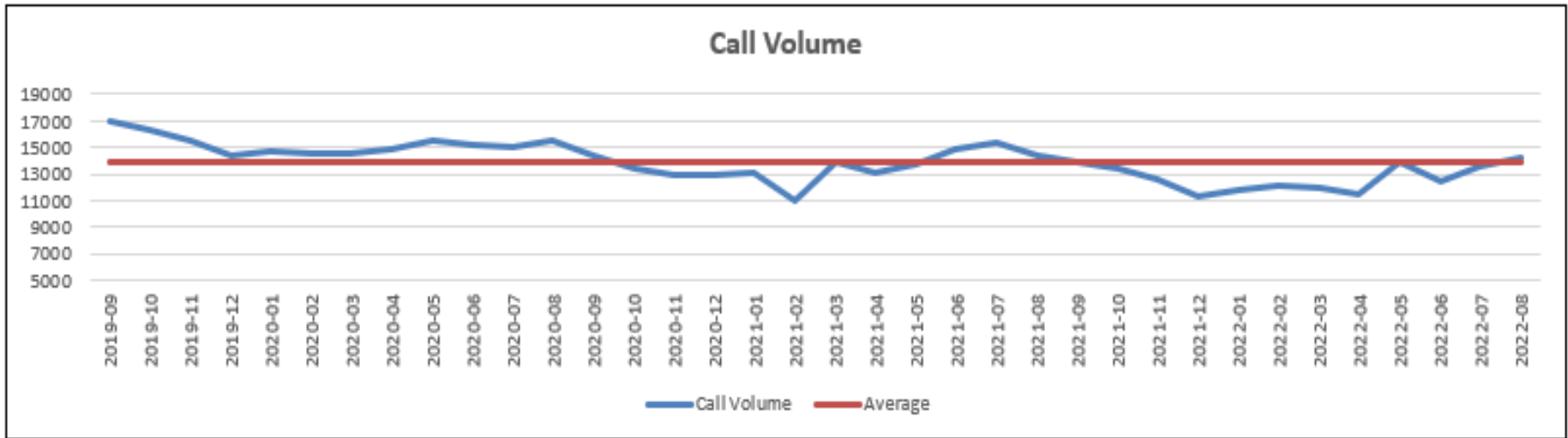

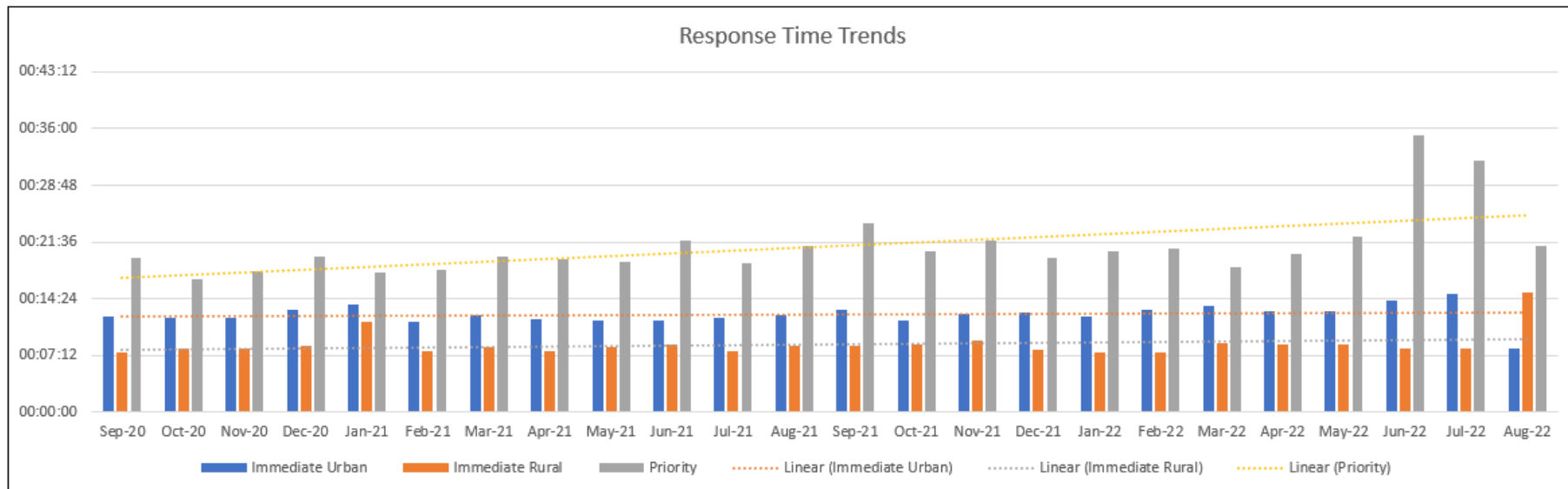
Call Volume trend (blue line) for the period 01st September 2019 – 31st August 2022.



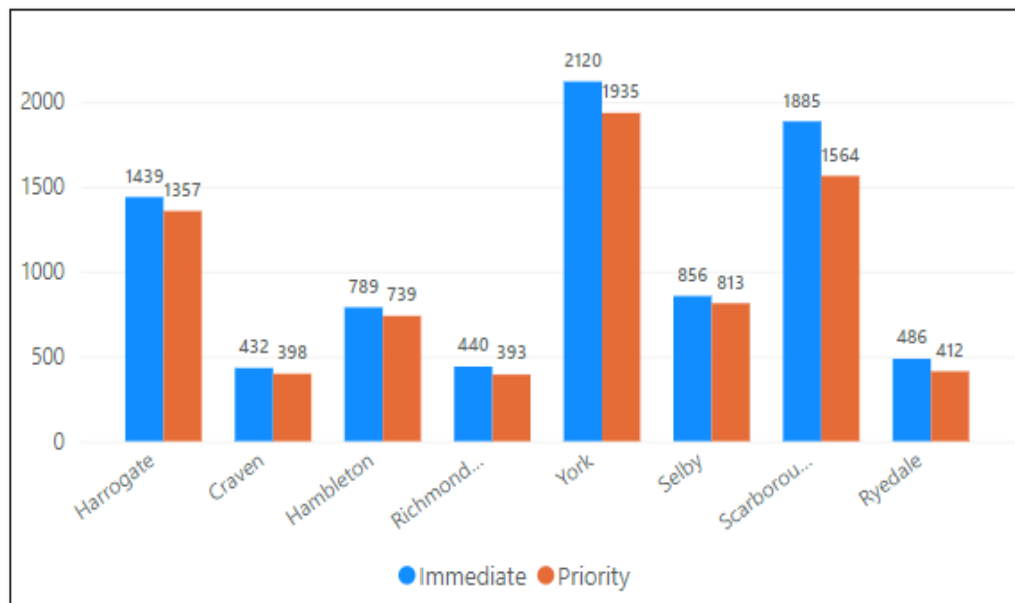

90 Day Data - Incident volumes by District (15/06/2022 – 11/09/2022)



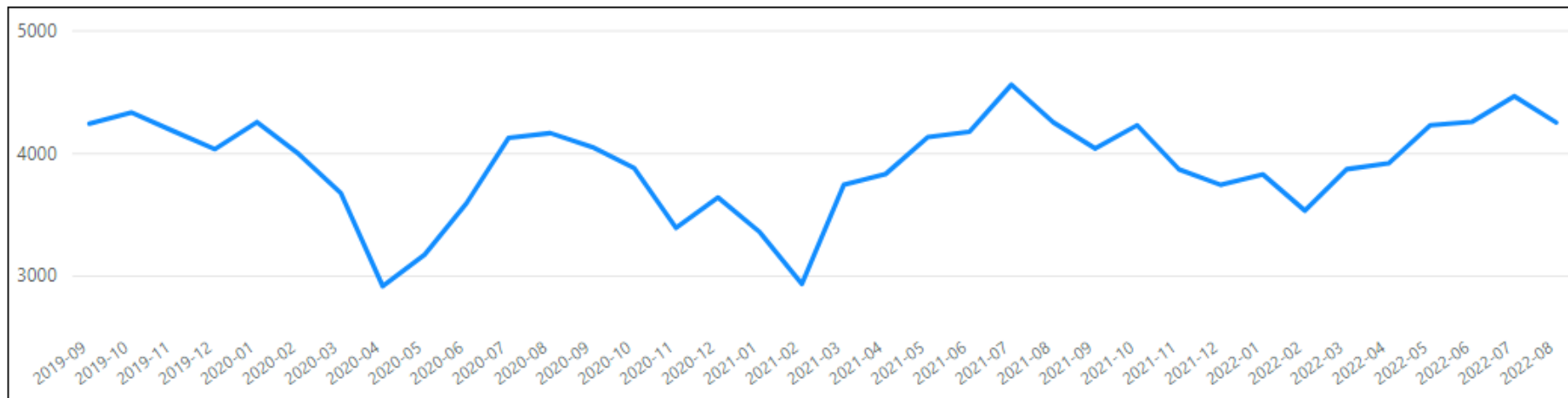

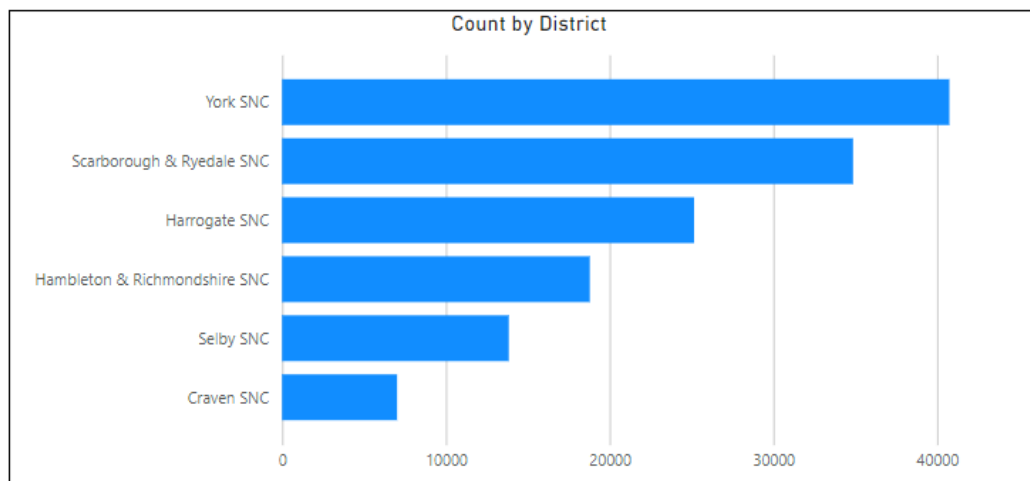


Crime Levels

3 Year Crime Trend (Period: 01st September 2019 – 31st August 2022)



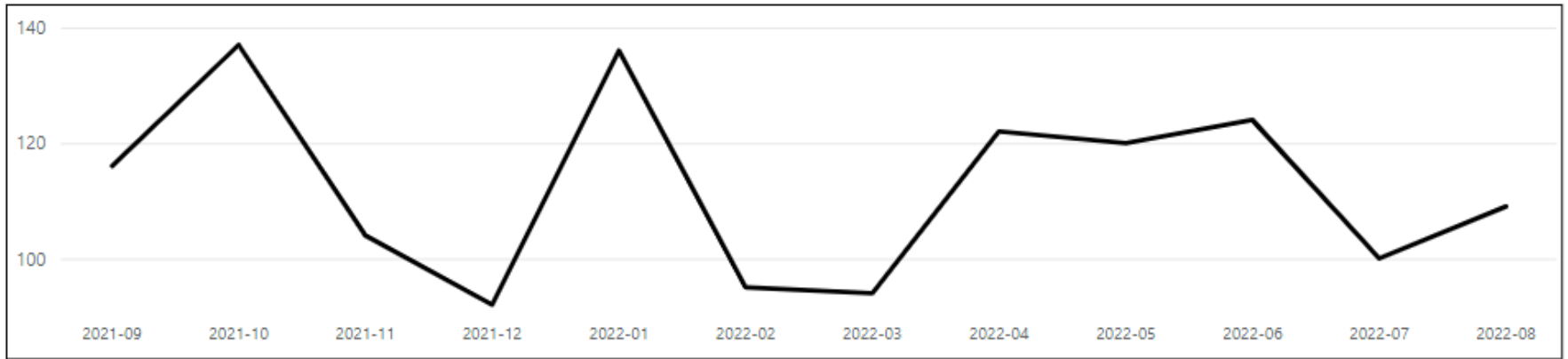

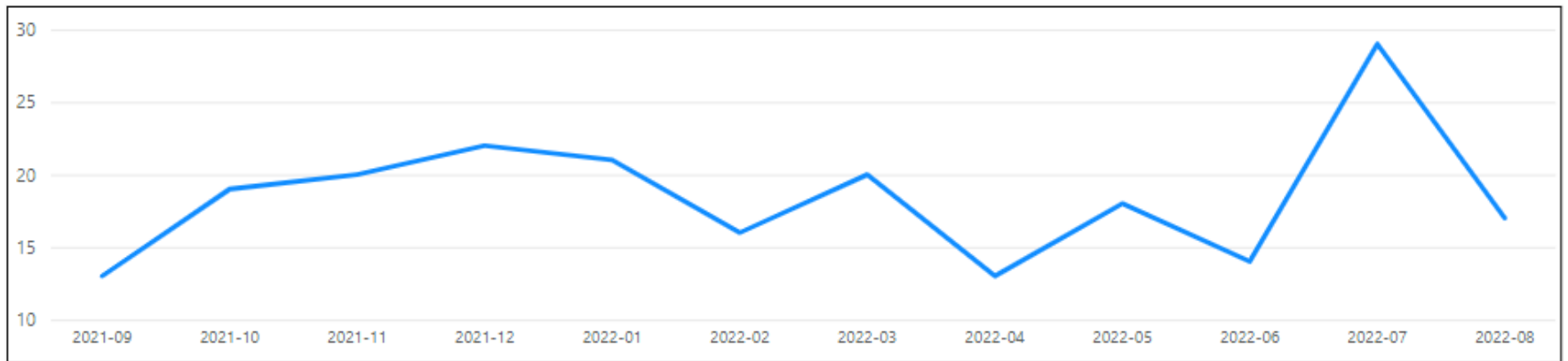

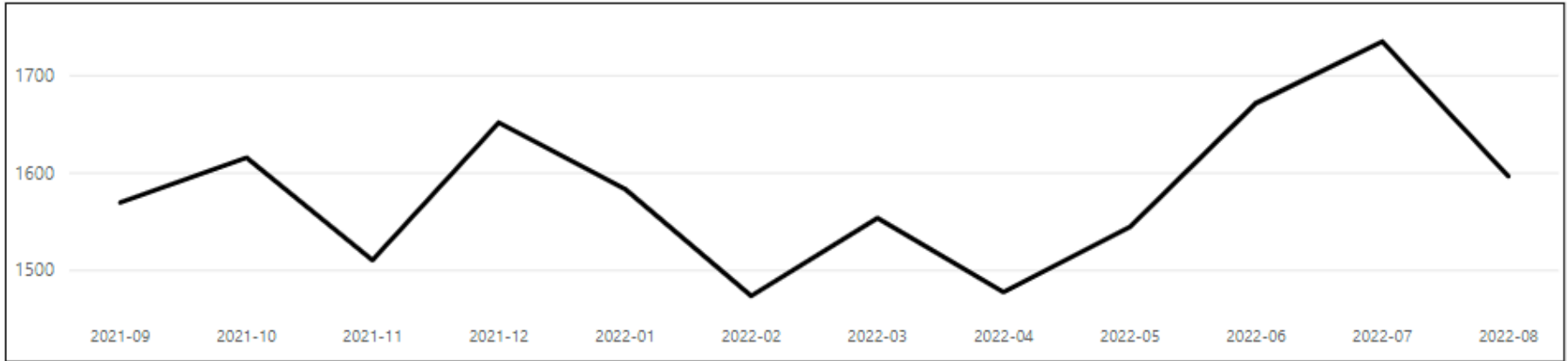

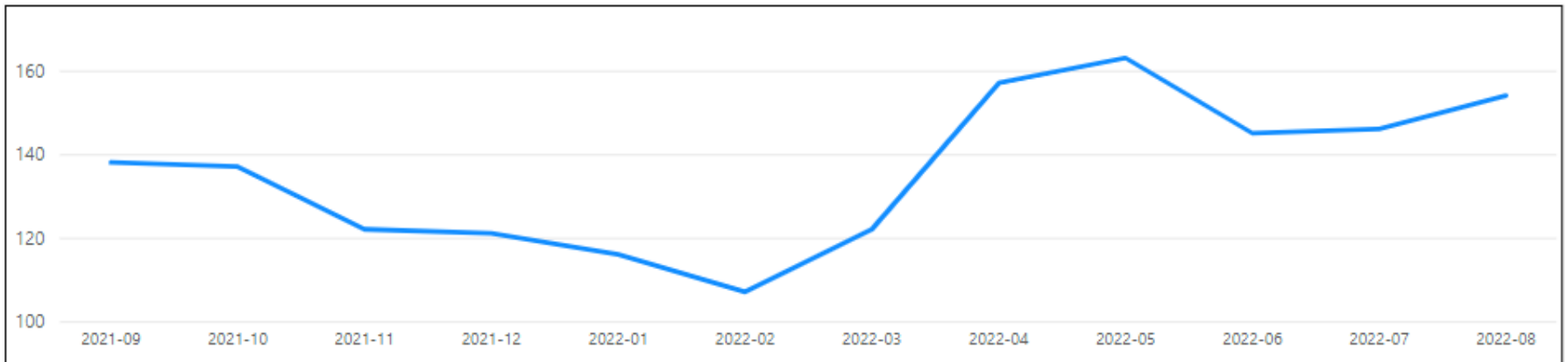

Crime Investigative Outcomes – All Crimes

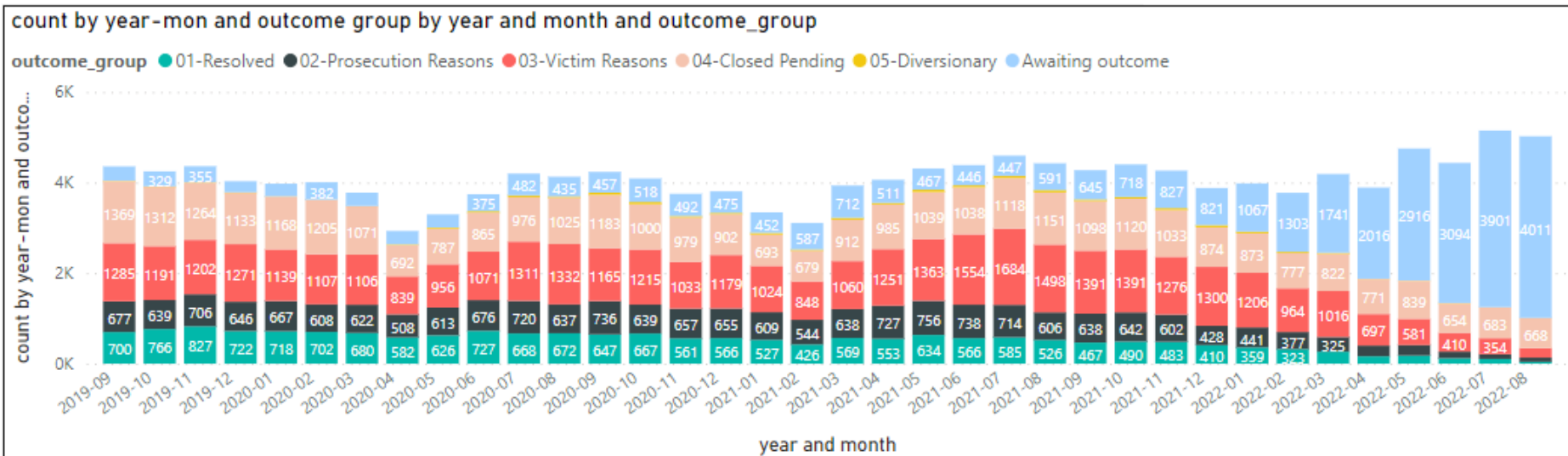

- August 2022 was higher than the average incident levels previously seen.
- 1 detainee required to be taken out of the county this month
- 13 incidents required police transportation, 4 following a risk assessment, 4 ambulance not available within 30 minutes, 3 ambulance not called, 2 ambulance re-tasked to a higher priority call.
- 13 incidents were transported by ambulance
- 31.03% of detentions resulted in Admission

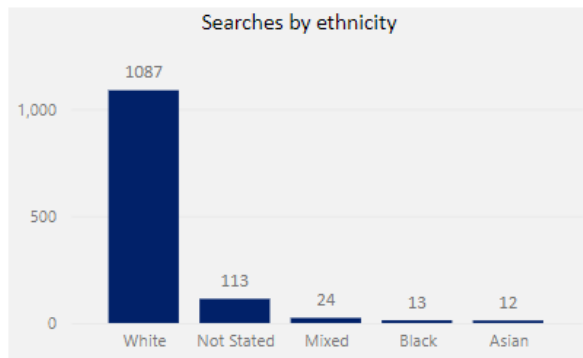

Force legitimacy (Stop Search – Ethnicity)

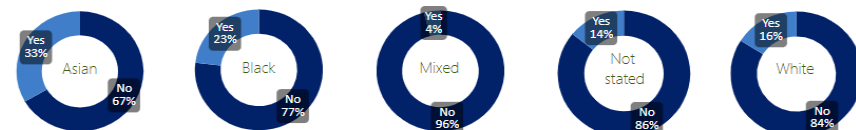

North Yorkshire is a safe place to live and attracts numerous visitors that enjoy its iconic sights and beautiful landscapes. In addition it attracts those who wish to cause harm. This section looks at the differential between residents and non-resident stop and search information (please note that some stop searches do not contain residential status)

Residents (73.73% of the total where place of residence is recorded)

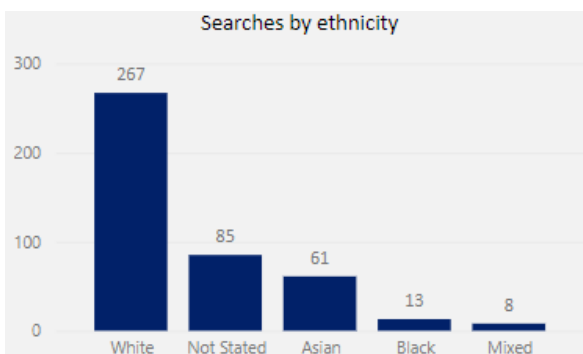


Black, Asian, Mixed ethnicities account for 3.92% of those searches where self-defined ethnicity was recorded. White ethnicity accounts for 87.03%

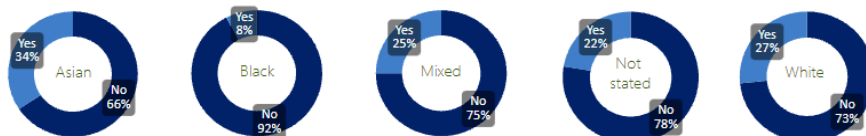


Stop searches where a positive outcome resulted (arrest, caution, penalty notice, summons or warning) ranged from 4.17% (Mixed ethnicity) to 33.33% (Asian ethnicity), and 16.10% (White ethnicity).

Non-residents



Black, Asian, Mixed ethnicities account for 17.08% of those searches where self-defined ethnicity was recorded. White ethnicity accounts for 65.62%



Stop searches where a positive outcome resulted (arrest, caution, penalty notice, summons or warning) ranged from 15.38% (Black ethnicity) to 40.00% (Mixed ethnicity), and 23.63% (White ethnicity).

Overall whilst there appears disproportionate stop search numbers based on ethnicity this is mainly reflected in stop search of non-residents. The higher positive outcome rates for non-residents supports the view that this is intelligence led, focussed on those who come into North Yorkshire to cause harm.

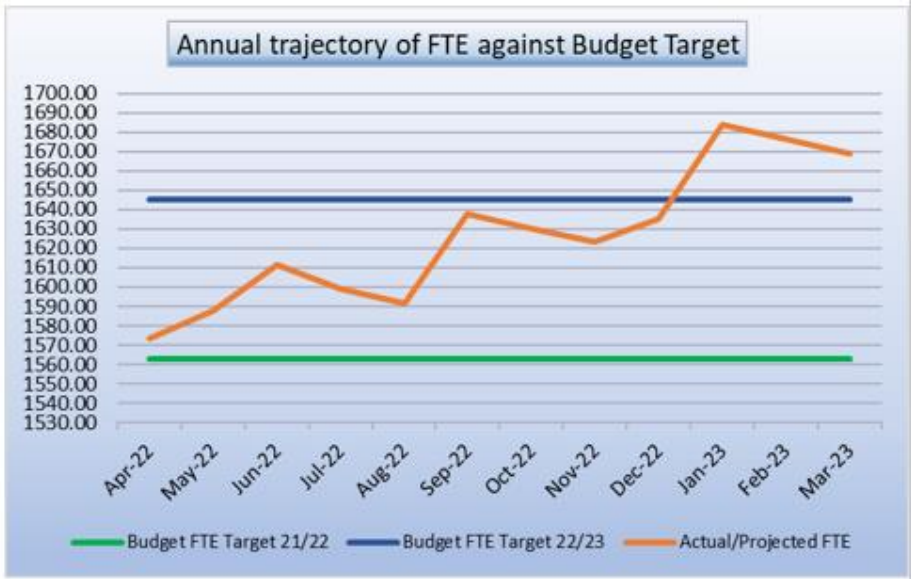

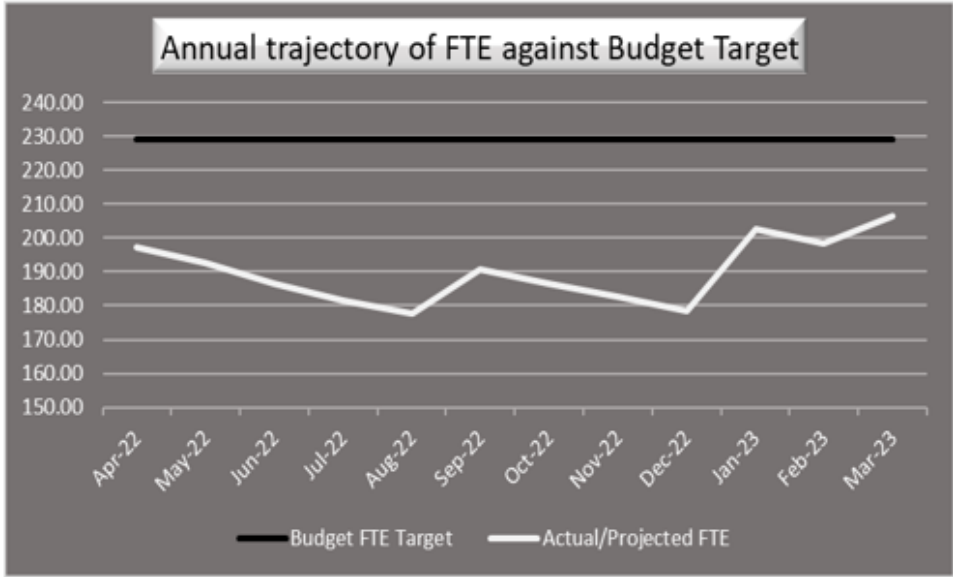

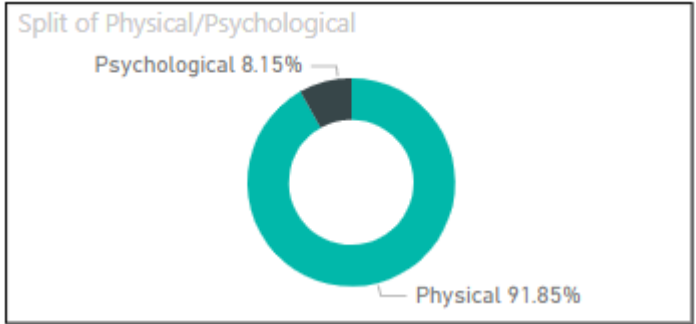
There is a clear upward trend for PCSOs, with recruitment plans in place to increase FTE.

The chart opposite takes account of projected attrition, based on an attrition rate for the last 3 years' average PCSO headcount.



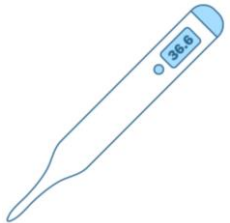
Sickness and Absence
