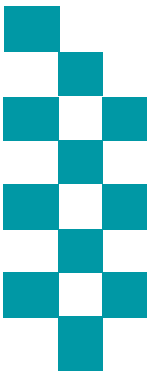

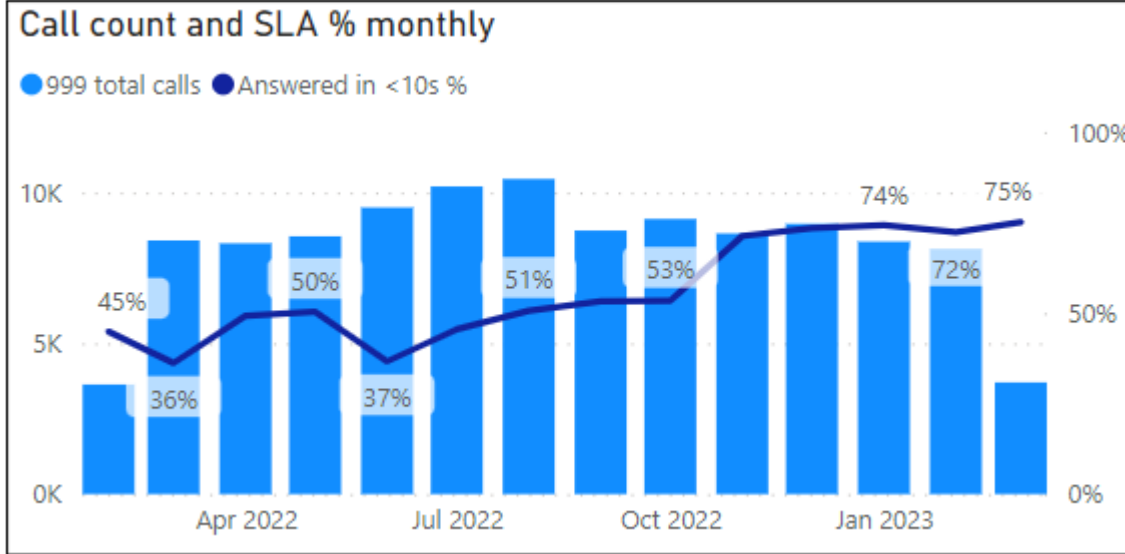

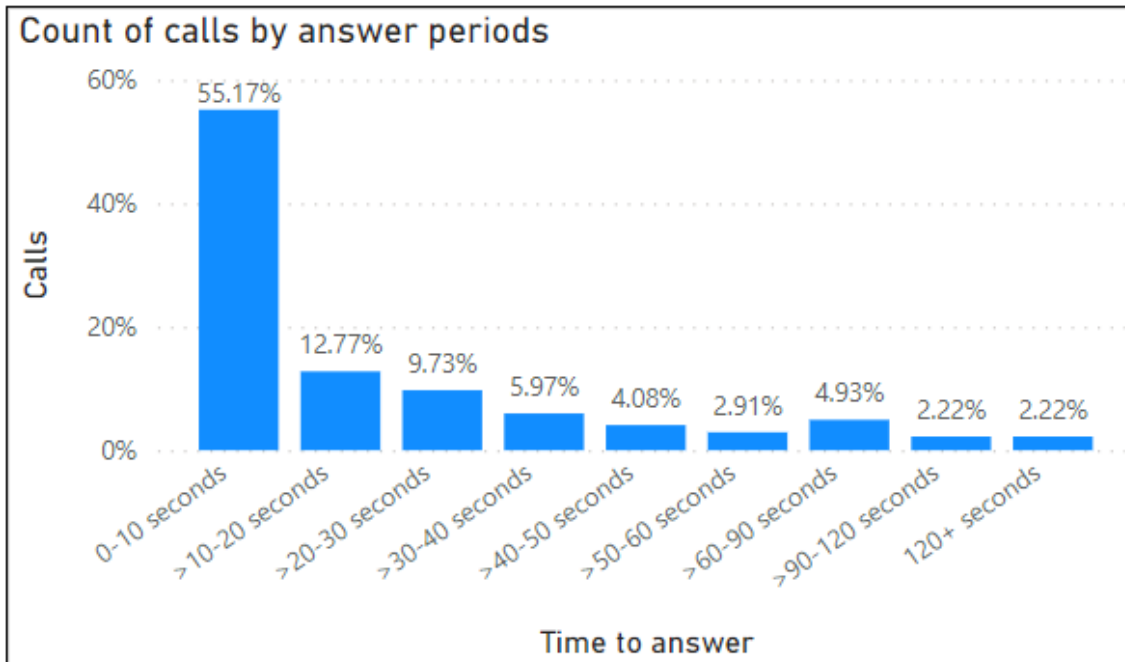

SLA – 90% of calls answered within 10 secs

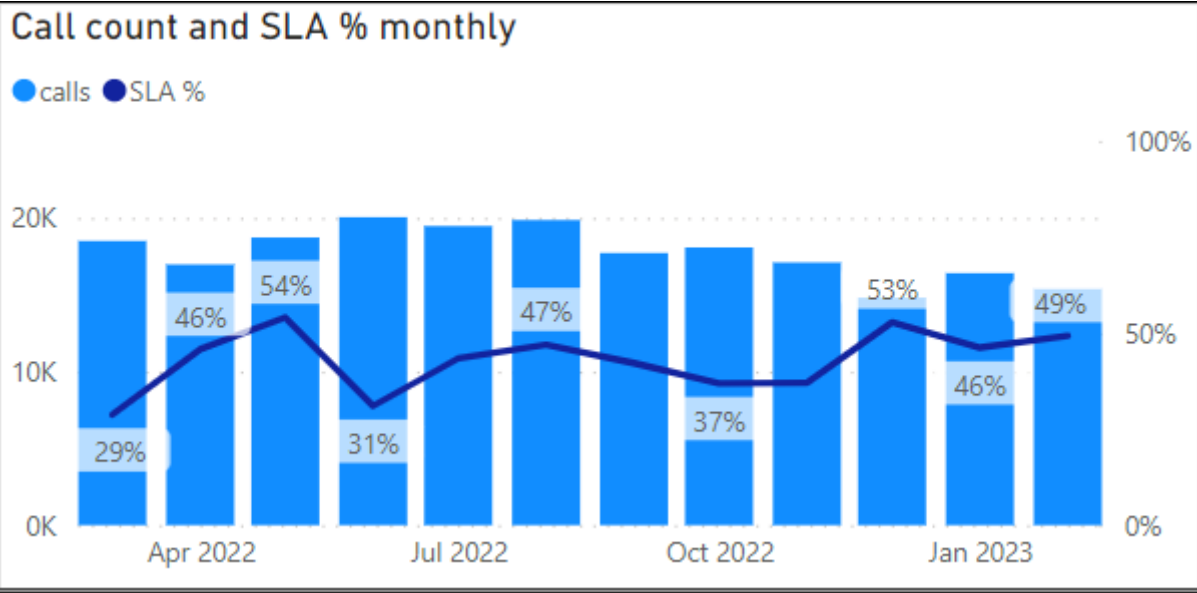

Non-emergency Calls

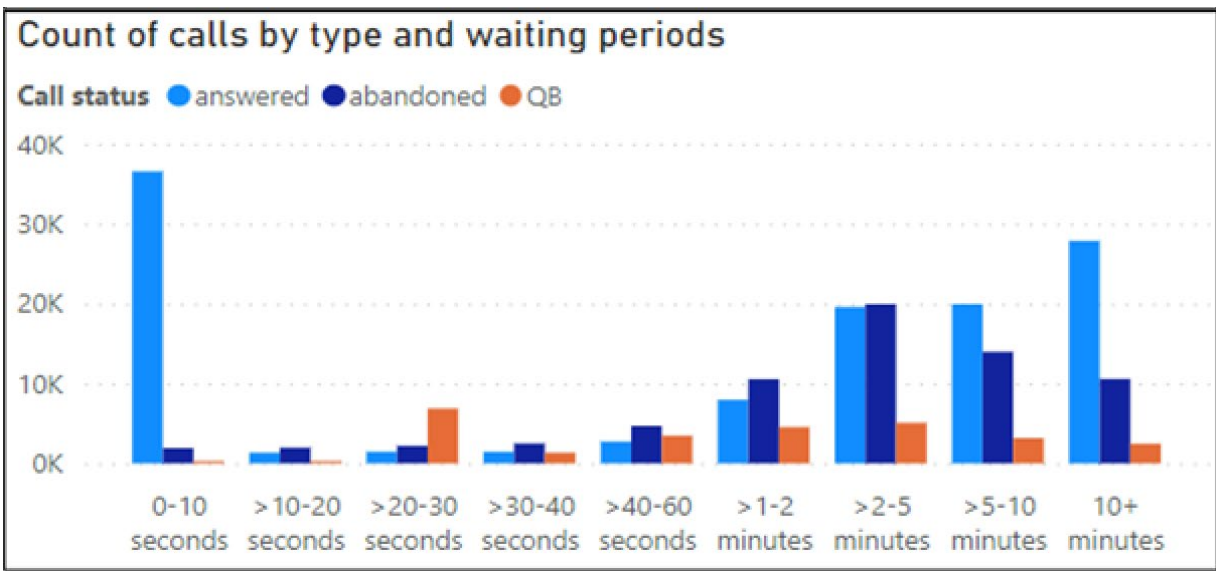

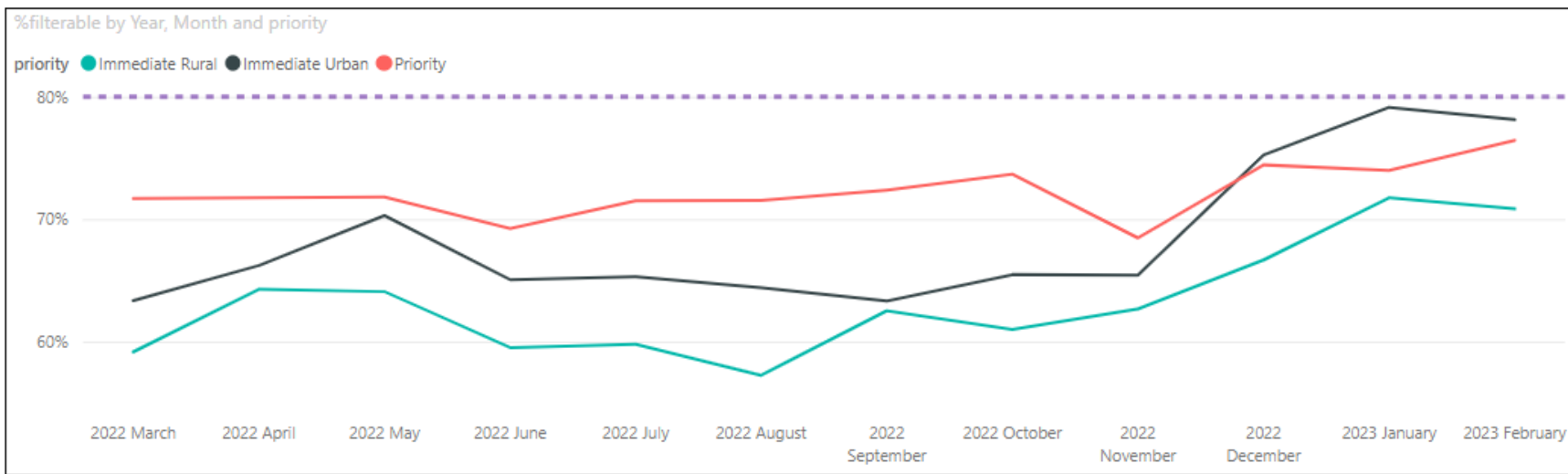

Our policing response

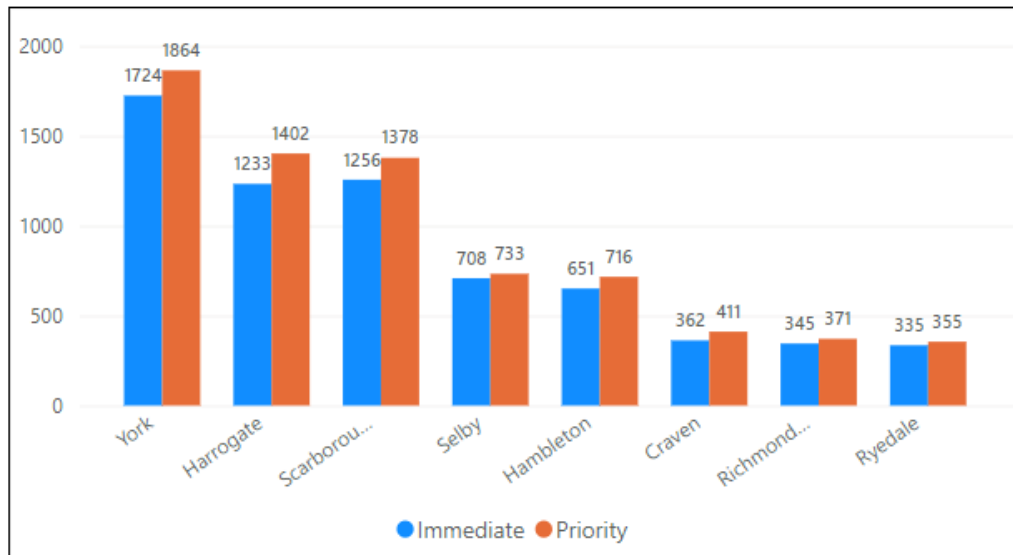


The national standards for response times are: **Immediate Urban** – 15mins / **Immediate Rural** – 20mins / **Priority** – 60mins.

This graphic shows NYP's compliance with these standards.

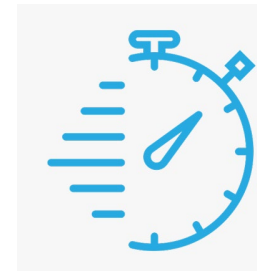
Purple dashed line represents target of 80% of incidents responded to in the above SLA as per national target

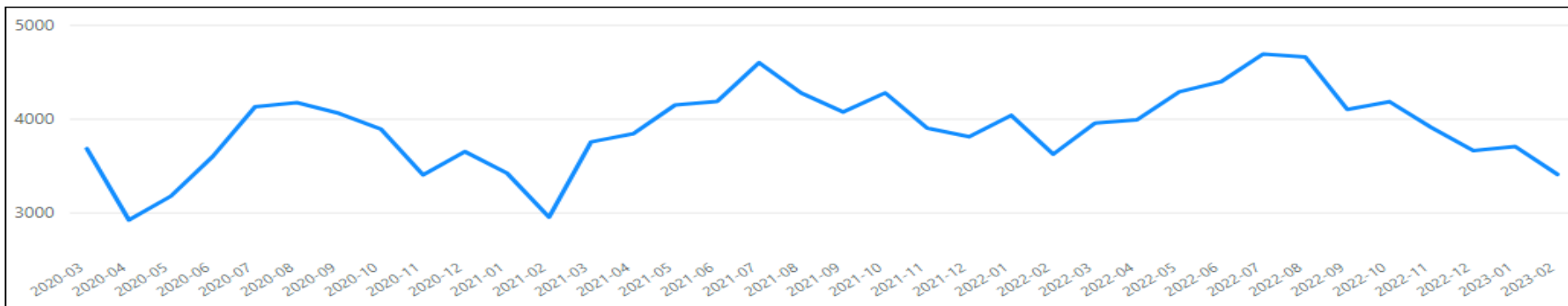

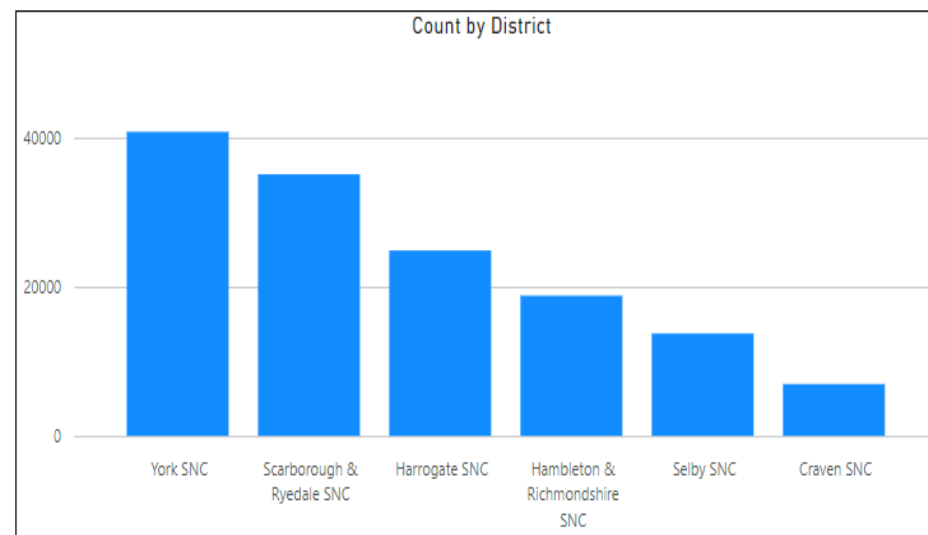

3 Year Crime Trend (Period: 01st March 2020 – 28th February 2023)



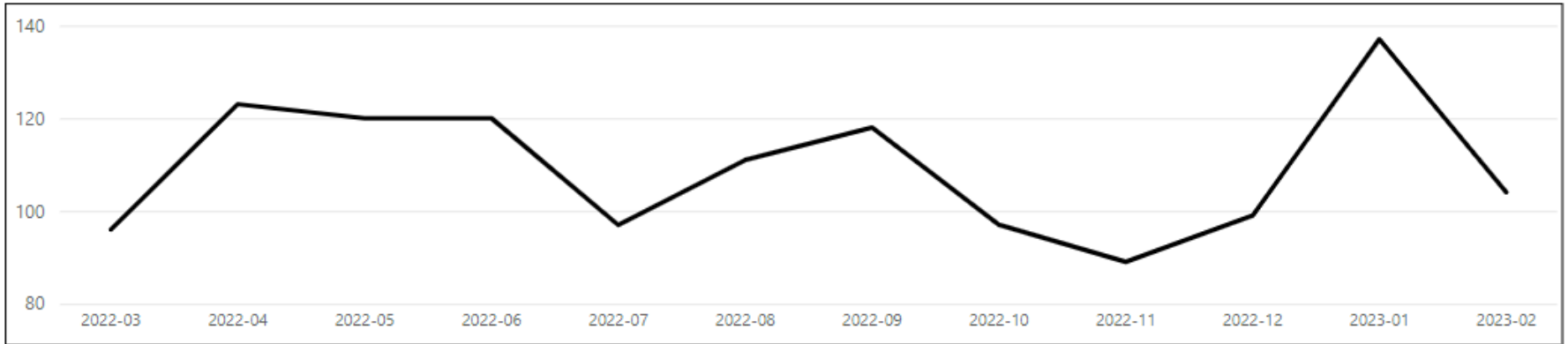

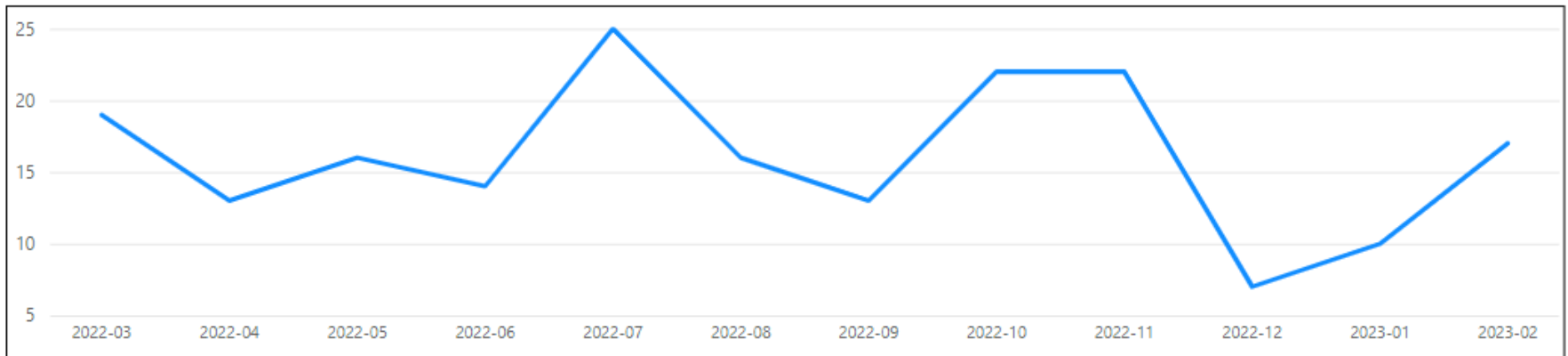

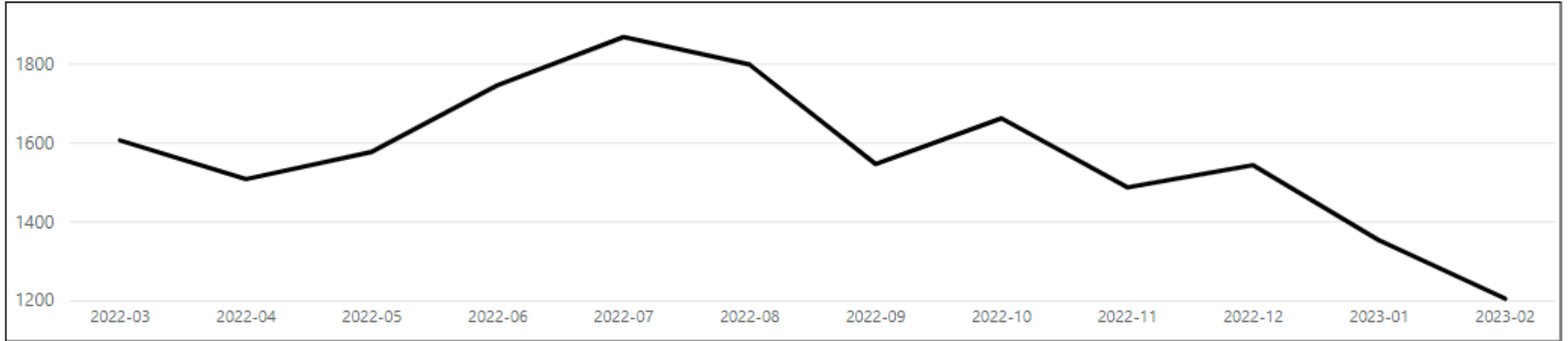

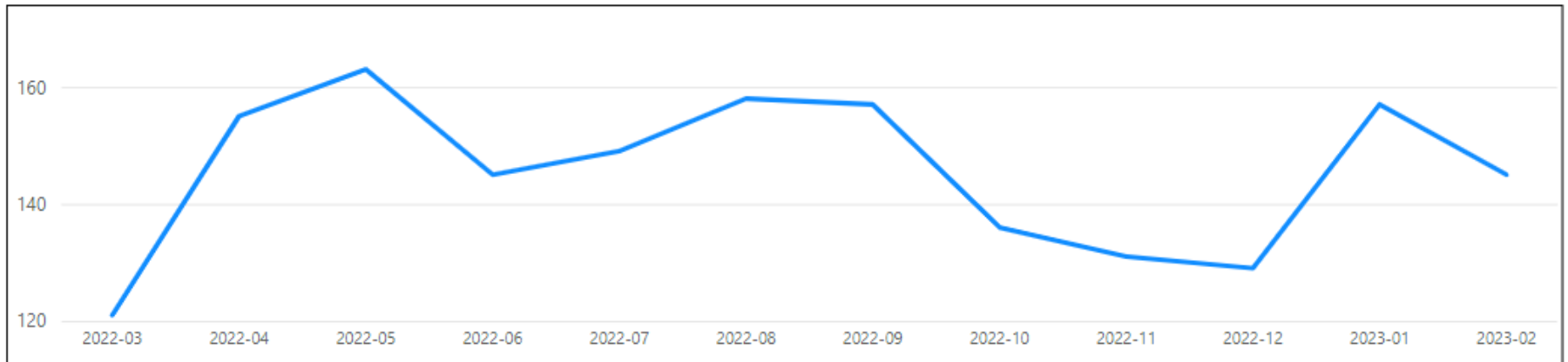

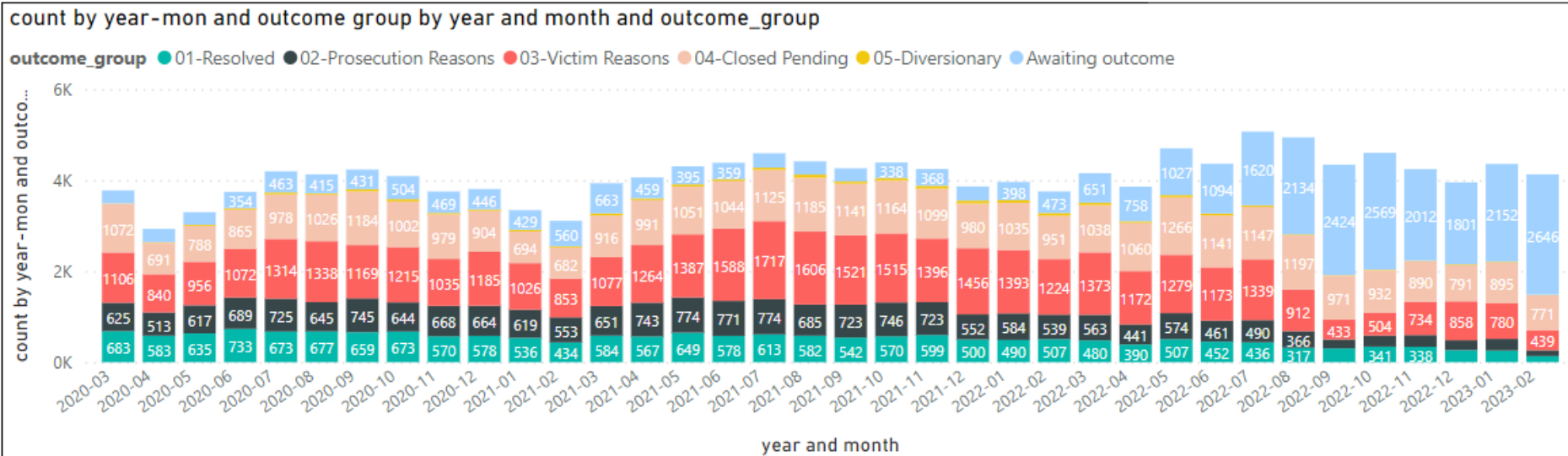

- February 2023 was lower than the average incident levels previously seen, however a large rise in avg officers and avg mins per occ.
- 0 detainees required to be taken out of the county this month
- 6 incidents required police transportation:
 - 1 following a risk assessment, 1 - Ambulance not available within 30 minutes, 2 - Ambulance weren't called.
- 8 incidents were transported by ambulance, 0 incidents not recorded.
- 1 method of transportation not recorded
- 26.67% of detentions resulted in Admission

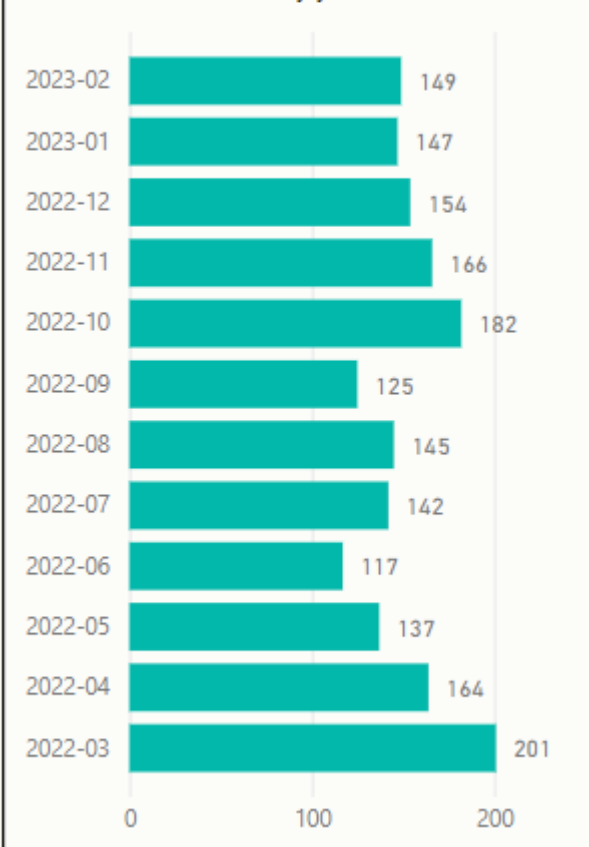

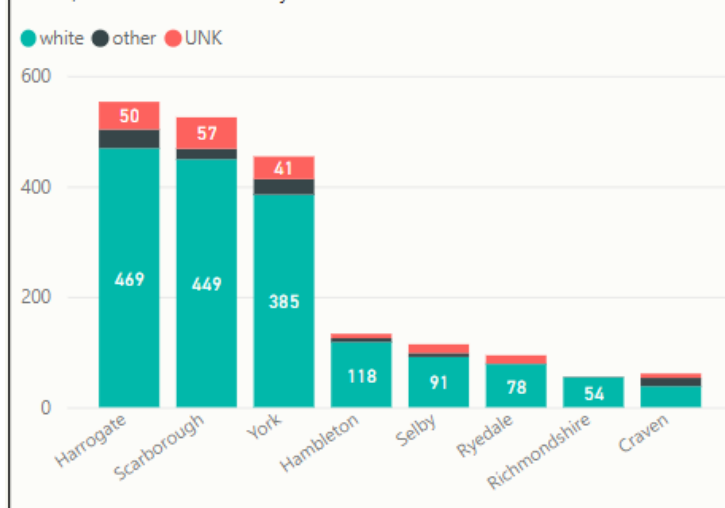
Distinct incident count by year-month



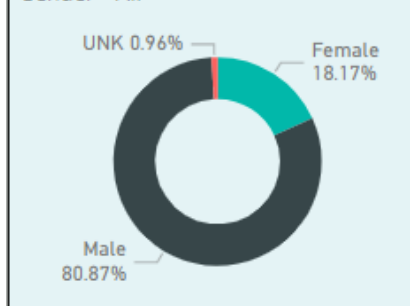
% who are NY resident



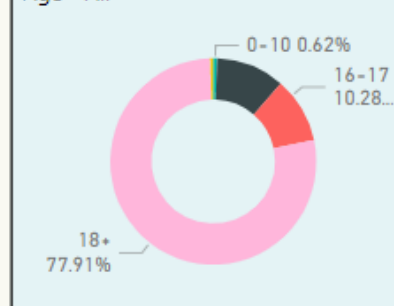

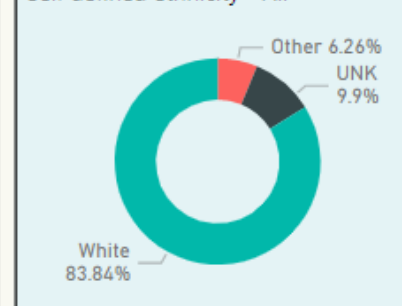

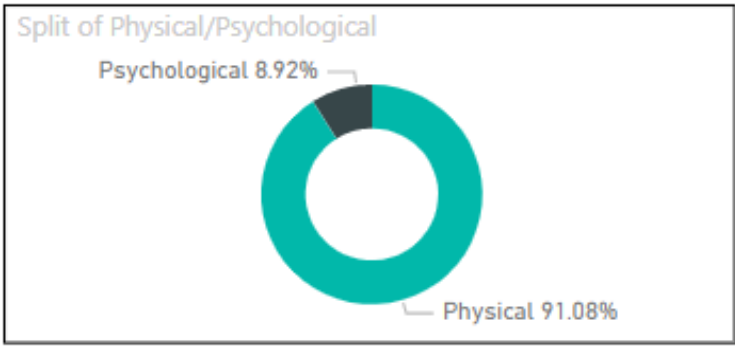
The actual PCSO FTE for January increased - the highest FTE this year since May 2022. However these numbers declined in February, and the trend shows that these will likely continue to do so.

The FTE count is still well below the budget and that trend follows again next month.



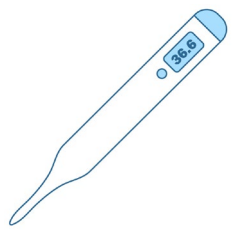
Sickness and Absence
